2. **Sect. 1:** In order to reduce the deaths caused by the fire
3. guns, citizens are required to buy registered bullets for
4. their guns.
5. **Sect. 2:** This will deter gun violence by tracking where the
6. bullets came from since each will be registered to the owner
7. when they're purchased.
8. **Sect. 3:** The Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms division of the
9. Department of Justice shall oversee that the bullets are
10. appropriately registered and disseminated.
11. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
12. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are

3. wifi Internet access in cities.

5. population over 25,000.

7. wifi system that must be easily accessed by the general
8. public.
9. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
10. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are

2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government should ban Pit Bulls as
3. domestic pets.
4. **Sect. 2:** A domestic pet is a pet kept inside or on the
5. property of a private citizen.
6. **Sect. 3:** Special permit may be obtained for zoos and other
7. special uses, as determined by the Animal Care division of
8. the USDA.
9. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
10. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
11. hereby declared null and void.

1. Be it enacted by this Congress that:
2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government should require all
3. citizens to recycle household plastics.
4. **Sect. 2:** Household plastics are defined as the plastic
5. containers and plastic waste products that are discarded.
6. **Sect. 3:** Failure to recycle such plastics would result in a
7. fine not to exceed \$1,000 per instance and would be enforced
8. by the Environmental Protection Agency.
9. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
10. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
11. hereby declared null and void.

1. Be it enacted by this Congress that:
2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government should abolish the
3. Common Core and other laws that limit educational content.
4. **Sect. 2:** The Common Core State Standards Initiative is a set
5. of education standards put into place to regulate all
6. education in the United States.
7. **Sect. 3:** Since many standards like Common Core limit what is
8. taught in classrooms across the United States, it should be
9. banned, along with other standards that restrict education.
10. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
11. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
12. hereby declared null and void.

1. Be it enacted by this Congress that:
2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government should require all
3. eligible citizens to vote for president.
4. **Sect. 2:** Because a large percentage of American do not vote
5. for the U.S. president, a law will require all citizens to
6. vote for the candidate of his or her choice.
7. **Sect. 3:** The U.S. Department of Justice will enforce and
8. ensure that all eligible citizens cast a presidential vote.
9. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
10. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
11. hereby declared null and void.

1. Be it enacted by this Congress that:
2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government ban sales of large-
3. sized soda.
4. **Sect. 2:** Large-sizes are defined as any container above 16
5. oz. Sodas are defined as sweetened drinks; the sweetener may
6. be sugar, high-fructose corn syrup, fruit juice, sugar
7. substitutes (in the case of diet drinks) or some combination
8. of these.
9. **Sect. 3:** Enforcement will be handled by the Food and Drug
10. Administration.
11. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
12. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
13. hereby declared null and void.

1. Be it enacted by this Congress that:
2. **Sect. 1:** The United States government should require parents
3. to not send their children to school if they are sick with a
4. contagious disease.
5. **Sect. 2:** A contagious disease is a type of infectious disease
6. that is communicable by contact with a patient suffering from
7. it, or with some secretion of, or object touched by, such a
8. patient.
9. **Sect. 3:** The United States Centers for Disease Control and
10. Prevention shall define and enforce such diseases.
11. **Sect. 4:** This bill will take effect on Jan. 1, 2015.
12. **Sect. 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are
13. hereby declared null and void.
