



**45th ANNUAL
TRAPPER RENDEZVOUS FORENSIC TOURNAMENT**

Dear Colleague:

The Northwest College Forensics Program extends to you a cordial invitation to attend the **45th ANNUAL TRAPPER RENDEZVOUS FORENSICS TOURNAMENT** to be held in Powell, Wyoming, on November 6-8, 2014. We sincerely hope you will be able to attend. Our goal is to provide good competition at a reasonable price and in a reasonable amount of time.

Please take special note of the topic strike system in parliamentary debate. It is the same striking system used at previous Trapper Rendezvous tournaments and Phi Rho Pi Nationals. Additionally, please note that NWC operates a closed tab room, and no warm room results will be posted.

The 2014 Rendezvous will feature: 6 preliminary and 2-4 elimination rounds (depending on entries) in three divisions of parliamentary debate. Should the need arise we reserve the right to collapse divisions in parliamentary debate. In addition, the Rendezvous will feature three preliminary rounds and two elimination rounds in one open division for eleven individual events. Please note that all individual events will follow NIET rules and format. We also will offer NFA-LD. We intend to offer 4 preliminary rounds with 2-3 elimination rounds (depending on entries).

This year we also offer an open division of British Parliamentary Debate, facilitated by Brent Northup from Carroll College.

Additionally, we will offer one open division of IPDA, because it is a Phi Rho Pi national event.

This invitation includes a copy of the regulations, a schedule of events, and contact information. A motel list for Powell and Cody is included, and we encourage you to make early reservations. The tournament entry should be received no later than **Tuesday, November 4th**. Entries will be facilitated by the Forensicstournament.net website.

We look forward to hosting you and your squad.

TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS: GENERAL

ELIGIBILITY: Any regularly enrolled full-time college student in good academic standing is eligible to attend this tournament. NWC students are eligible to participate and advance in all events. NWC is ineligible for sweepstakes.

AWARDS: Awards will be given for all finalists in all categories of competition. Two third place awards will be presented in all divisions of debate. Top speakers in Parliamentary debate will be recognized and receive an award. Awards will also be given for 1st and 2nd in Overall Sweepstakes.

JUDGES: Because of the scarcity of judges in Powell, it is necessary to hire judges from the surrounding communities. In order to pay their expenses we will charge a \$40.00 judging fee for each debate team not covered by a judge or for every six individual events slots not covered. One judge covers ten total i.e. slots, two LDers, two NPDA teams, 4 IPDA teams, and n-1 Worlds teams. All judges are expected to remain available for judging through the individual events finals.

Practices and Standards: NWC subscribes to and will abide by the NPDA rules and bylaws, the IPDA Constitution and bylaws, and the AFA Code of Standards.

TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS: INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

CONFLICT POLICY: Students may enter up to three (3) individual events in conflict patterns A and B, but must accept any hardships created by multiple entries. EXTEMPERS CHOOSING DOUBLE ENTRY WILL BEAR THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PERFORMING WITHIN THE ALLOTTED SCHEDULED ROUND TIME WHETHER THEIR OTHER ENTRY ALLOWS THEM THEIR 30 MINUTES OF PREP TIME OR NOT.

MATERIAL REQUIREMENTS: All individual events programs, speeches, and materials used by participants should be composed of materials not used in competition prior to September 1, 2014. Specific rules will follow general AFA-NIET guidelines and will be available at the tournament.

NFA LD: There will be one open division (with sufficient entries). There will be six preliminary rounds of NFA-LD debate. STUDENTS IN ELIMINATION ROUNDS OF LD BEAR THE RESPONSIBILITY OF COMPETING IN THEIR INDIVIDUAL EVENTS AND LD.

Time limits for NFA LD are: (6-3-7-3-6-6-3; 4 minutes prep)

The 2014-15 resolution is RESOLVED: The United States federal government should increase its development of the Earth's moon in one or more of the following areas:
Energy, minerals, and/or water.

TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS: DEBATE

Open Parliamentary Debate: Open to anyone eligible to attend the meet.

Junior Parliamentary Debate: Open to students in their first or second year of college debate.

Novice Parliamentary Debate: A novice team must consist of two debaters with little or no prior debate experience in any kind of debate. The intent of this definition is to limit entry to students who are new or are beginning their debate careers.

PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE: There will be six preliminary rounds and appropriate elimination rounds in debate divisions. The 7-8-4-5 format will be used. Prep time will be 15 minutes. Topics will be taken from current political and social issues of the day. A topic striking system similar to that employed at Phi Rho Pi Nationals will be employed. Three topics will be provided every round. The judge will give a copy of three topics to the opposition team, which will have 30 seconds to strike one topic. The judge will then give the copy of the topics to the government team, which will have 30 seconds to strike a second topic. The topic that was not struck by either team will be debated in the round. Two prelim rounds will feature policy topics, two will feature value topics, and two will feature metaphorical topics. In elimination rounds, the topic choices will feature one metaphor, one value, and one policy. Also, please note that there will be NO WARM ROOM at this tournament.

Worlds Style Debate: Open to anyone eligible to attend the meet. The division will follow the WUDC format, with 15 minutes preparation time and 7 minute speeches. Topics will be derived from current political and social issues of the day. One

IPDA: Open to anyone eligible to attend the meet. Topics will be derived from current political and social issues of the day. We will use the 5-2-6-2-3-5-3 format with thirty (30) minutes of preparation time. Debaters will be presented with five resolutions; each debater will be allowed to strike two resolutions, thus leaving one resolution to be debated.
