

A Bill to Legalize Transplant Organ Sales

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1: The sale of human organs for the sole purpose of transplant is now legal within the United States of America.

SECTION 2: The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) will oversee the exchange of transplant organs and act as the regulatory entity.

SECTION 3: In order to fund the new efforts required of the DHHS, a 5% excise tax shall be placed on all organ sales within the first year of implantation with a review period of afterward to increase as needed up to 10%.

SECTION 4: This law shall take effect January 1, 2015.

SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Update the Clean Air Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1: The Clean Air Act of 1990 shall hereby be amended to acknowledge the presence of greenhouse gases.

SECTION 2: Any reference to “climate change” within the legislation shall be read with the fact that greenhouse gasses contribute to that phenomenon.

SECTION 3: The Environmental Protection Agency shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

A. The Environmental Protection Agency is hereby permitted to regulate the emissions of greenhouse gasses upon the passage of this legislation.

B. An appropriate of \$500 million is made to the Environmental Protective Agency for research purposes.

SECTION 4: This legislation shall take effect immediately.

SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Allocate Funds for Counter-terrorism in The Sahel Region of Africa

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1: \$500 million will be added to the annual budget every year for three years to secure American military bases and increase military police training operations in the Sahel.

SECTION 2: “The Sahel” encompasses all or parts of 12 countries from the Atlantic Ocean to the Red Sea: Senegal, the Gambia, Mauritania, Mali, Burkina, Faso, Niger, Nigeria, Chad, Sudan, Ethiopia, Eritrea, and Djibouti.

SECTION 3: The funds will go to The Bureau of Political-Military Affairs within the United States Department of State to enforce this bill.

SECTION 4: This law will take effect in the fiscal year 2015.

SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Embargo Russia

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1: The United States federal government shall place a full economic embargo on Russia.

SECTION 2: Sanctions shall be removed upon Russia's withdrawal from Crimea and their recognition of Ukraine as a sovereign nation.

SECTION 3: Enforcement will be through the Department of Commerce.

SECTION 4: This law will take effect immediately upon passage.

SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
