

A Bill to Limit Presidential Terms to Two Years

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:

1. **Section 1:** The U.S. president's terms shall not exceed two years. The
2. twenty-second amendment states that no person shall be
3. elected to the office of the President more than twice. This
4. amendment will still be active meaning you can only be
5. president for a total of four years.
6. **Section 2:** The current presidential limits do not allow for a term to
7. exceed four years.
8. **Section 3:** The Congress will oversee the enforcement of this bill and
9. will amend the Constitution accordingly.
10. **Section 4:** This bill will take effect on January 1st, 2017. This bill will be
11. established for 2020 in the next presidential election.
12. **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and
13. void.

A Bill to Legalize the Right to Die in the United States

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:

1. **Section 1.** This bill will legalize the Right to Die in the United States for
2. patients with a mental or physical terminal injury.
3. **Section 2.** The Right To Die allows doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to people
4. who are terminally ill and who wish to terminate their lives.
5. **Section 3.** The Food and Drug Administration provides guidance in
6. managing drugs given to patients by doctors and would oversee
7. The execution of this bill.
8. **Section 4.** This bill will be enacted starting from January 1st, 2017..
9. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
10. and void.

A Bill to Raise the Minimum Wage

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:

1. **Section 1.** A bill to raise the minimum wage to \$15.00 an hour.
2. **Section 2.**
3. A. Minimum wage is the lowest amount of money paid per hour
4. according to the federal law.
5. B. The current minimum wage is \$7.25.
6. **Section 3.** The Department of Labor will oversee this bill to ensure that the
7. minimum wage standards are met.
8. **Section 4.** This bill will be implemented on the 1st of January 2017.
9. **Section 5.** All other laws that are in conflict of this new policy shall hereby
10. be declared null and void.

A Bill to Lower the Driving Age

BE ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT

1. **Section 1:** This bill will lower the driving age to thirteen.

3. must meet the requirements of the state's current Department of Motor Vehicles laws.
4. Individual states' Department of Motor Vehicles must create their own regulations regarding
5. the size of any youth under the age of sixteen.
6. **Section 3:** The Department of Motor Vehicles of each state will regulate and oversee the
7. enforcement of this law. Police departments and courts of law within state boundaries will
8. enforce punishments given to defendants found guilty of breaking the laws listed within that
9. state's Department of Motor Vehicles.
10. **Section 4:** This bill shall be put into action starting January 1, 2017.
- 11.. **Section 5:** All laws conflicting with this piece of legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Renewable Energy

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **Section 1:** This bill will provide tax breaks for companies investing in renewable
3. energy.
4. **Section 2:** Renewable energy is defined as a source of power that can be created
5. repeatedly in order to sustain our power supply. It is also eco-friendly to the
6. environment and is safer than other types of energy, such as fossil
7. fuels. Renewable energy includes hydro, nuclear, solar, wind, etc.
8. **Section 3:** The Department of Energy will overtake this project into increasing the
9. production of energy.
10. **Section 4:** This legislation will be in effect October 12th, 2017.

A Bill to Lower the Age Restriction for Voting

1. **Section 1.** The United States Constitution should be amended to lower the voting age

3. **Section 2.** The current age restriction is 18 years old. Having voters as low as 10
4. years old can include more opinion and help get rid of ageism.
5. **Section 3.** Congress will oversee the enforcement of the bill by amending the
6. Constitution.
7. **Section 4.** This bill take effect on the next presidential election (year: 2020).
8. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Tax Credit for Daily Bike Riders

3 daily. This can be regulated by employee's bosses that log their employer's
4 bicycle commute. For those that are self-employed, they will record their
5 distance using log sheets. If the self-employed biker is caught lying on their
6 log sheet, this will be considered tax evasion, they will face up to two years in
7 prison. The federal tax credit shall be 5% of the biker's yearly income.

8 **Section 3.** The United States Environmental Protection Agency will oversee the
9 enforcement of the bill by recording the bikers' information and reporting it to
10 the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

11 **Section 4.** This bill will be implemented no later than March 1, 2017.

12 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Abortion

6. dangerous to the health.
7. **Section 3.** The Congress shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.
8. **Section 4.** This bill will take effect starting at January 1, 2017.
9. **Section 5.** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
10. shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Reform the United States Education System

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. **SECTION 1:** All funding in regards to the United States public school system shall be put
2. into a voucher system. Each student's family will receive a grant of \$11,000
3. each year to be invested into a school of the family's choice.

4. **SECTION 2:**

5. A. An education voucher, in a voucher system, is a certificate of government
6. funding for a student at a school chosen by the student or the student's
7. parents.

8. B. Public schools shall be limited to K-12 grades and not the public university
9. system.

10. **SECTION 3:** The US Department of Education shall oversee all of the changes and the
11. implementation of the voucher system.

12. **SECTION 4:** This bill shall be implemented no later than August 1, 2017.

13. **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reform Social Security

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. **SECTION 1:** Social security shall incrementally be abolished and replaced by a
2. government run 401(P) program. All people who currently have paid
3. for or are in the process of paying for Social Security shall be allowed
4. to keep their investment in Social Security, but starting July 1, 2017,
5. all retirement plans shall be turned into 401(P)s. The 401(P) Program
6. will invest in various index funds with the assistance of a transitional
7. board headed by John Clifton Bogle.

8. **SECTION 2:**

9. A. Social Security is defined as any government system that provides
10. monetary assistance to people with an inadequate income.

11. B. An index fund is a type of mutual fund with a portfolio constructed
12. to match or track the components of a market index, such as the
13. Standard & Poor's 500 Index (S&P 500). An index mutual fund is
14. said to provide broad market exposure, low operating expenses and
15. low portfolio turnover.

16. **SECTION 3:** The Social Security Administration (SSA) shall regulate and
17. oversee the transition of this bill.

18. **SECTION 4:** Considering the urgency of this problem, this bill will be implemented
19. no later than July 1, 2017 (the beginning of the fiscal year).

20. **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
21. void.
