



Interp Cinema

We will be offering a new film event called Interp Cinema. The purpose of this event is to provide students with hands-on filmography experience. Students should control the project from beginning to end with only guidance from instructors/coaches. This event will follow the guidelines of an interp event. Below is a list of guidelines and rules.

- Film Length: 7 to 10 minutes
- Original Script
 - **Students** must write an original script
- Group size: 3 to 5 people
 - 3 people must be included in the film “on screen”
 - Non “on screen” roles: Director, Editing Director
- No props or costumes: participants must wear tournament attire in video.
- Performances should be recorded in a classroom or tournament-like location.
- Editing is allowed. Film does not need to be completed in one take.
- Although not required, film may have an introduction similar to a standard interpretation.
- Credits
 - List of participants and their roles in the film
 - Academy/school/team
 - Coach
 - Age Group, upper 9th-12th or lower 3th-8th
- Judging Criteria
 - Performance
 - Relation to tournament theme – Respect
 - Blocking
 - Message
 - Script

To participate in this event, schools/academies must register on [forensictournament.net](http://www.forensictournament.net) and enter in Pattern F (Readers Theatre). The fee for this event is \$45.
