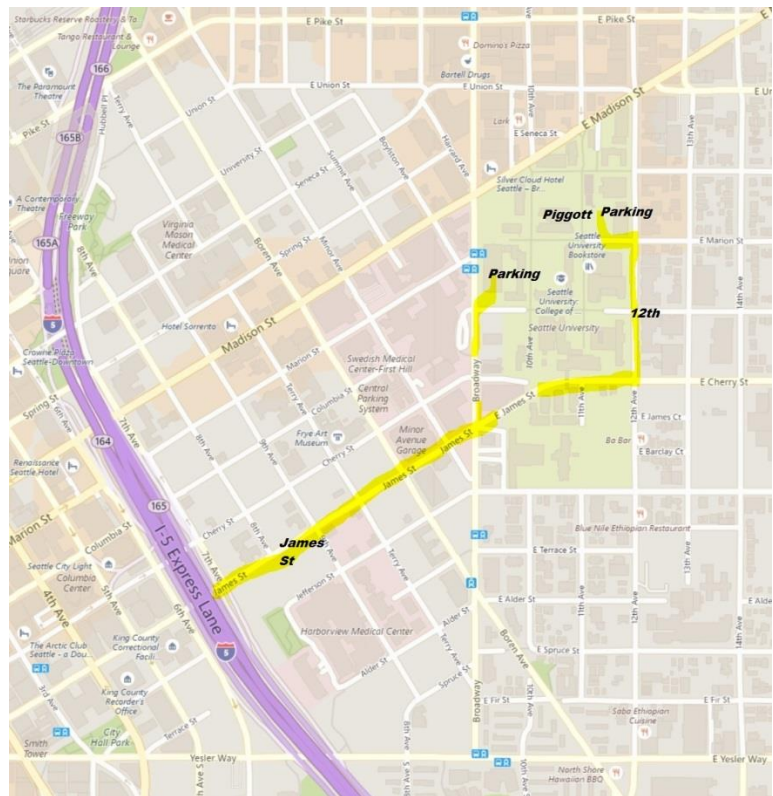
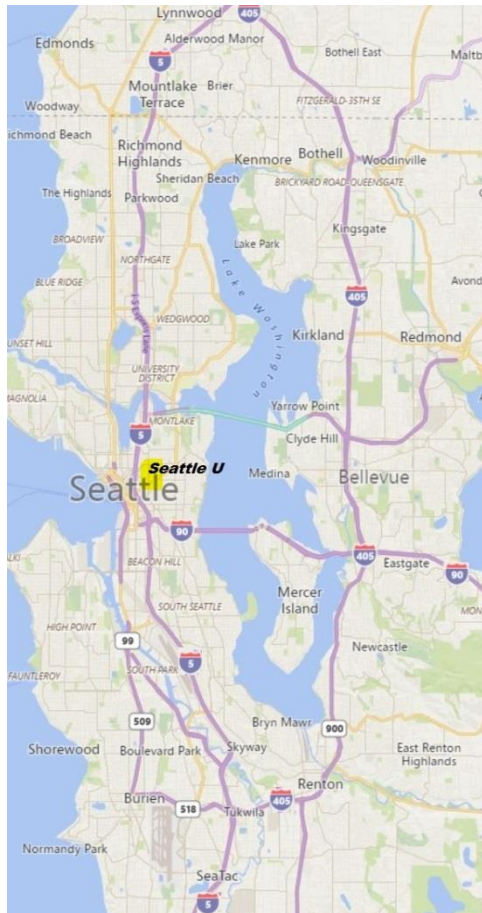
Seattle University is a smoke free campus.

4. ROAD CONDITIONS

For those traveling on Interstate 5, there are backups and slowdowns even in off peak hours; getting waze, gps, or mac/google map traffic updates would be helpful; traffic can be slow EVEN on Sundays including in the afternoons and evenings.

5. DRIVING TO THE TOURNAMENT?

- Go to the Pigott Building at Seattle University.
- Take the James Street Exit off of Interstate 5.
- After exiting, take James Street going east (up the hill, away from downtown).
- Make a left at 12th avenue.
- Drive on 12th to Marion where you make a left turn and go into the parking lot.

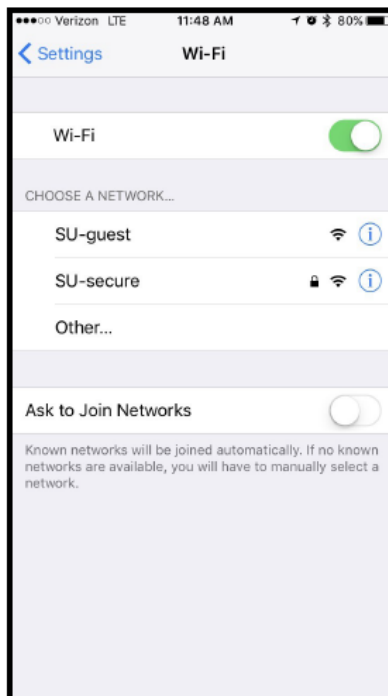

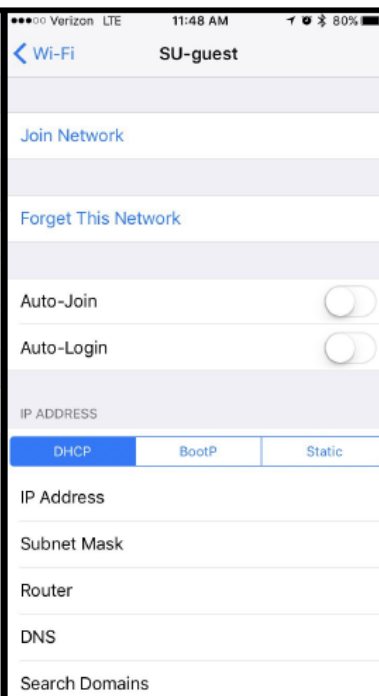
GENERAL INFORMATION

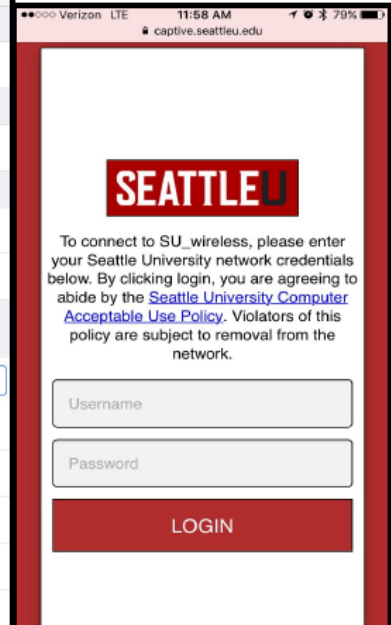
Step 1: Open your Wi-Fi settings and click the information icon for SU-guest
