

A Bill to Disarm Patrol Officers

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. This bill shall prohibit patrol officers from carrying and/or using a firearm.

SECTION 2. “Patrol officers” shall be defined as police officers that are assigned to a specific geographic area, also known as a “beat cop”. “Firearm” is defined as a rifle, pistol or any other portable gun.

SECTION 3. The enforcement will be through the Department of Justice. If a state or local law enforcement agency does not abide by this law, they will lose all federal funding for law enforcement.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented immediately.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Designate Internet Access as a Public Service in the United States

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. As America has evolved, access to internet has become as necessary to functioning as other public services subsidized and maintained by the government.

SECTION 2. Internet Access should not be a privilege for the wealthy, but rather accessible to all Americans.

SECTION 3. Internet will be defined as a global computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities, consisting of interconnected networks using standardized communication protocols. Access will be defined as publicly available internet in all areas that house American citizens.

SECTION 4. This legislation will be instituted by the Federal Communications Commission, as a function of their duties and parameters.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Impose Taxes on Every Online Stock Transaction to Increase Government Funding on Certain Areas

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Small amount of taxes is to be imposed on every online stock transaction to increase government funding on certain areas in need of urgent attention, such as the healthcare system and infrastructure constructions.

SECTION 2. Online stock transactions is the process in which assets are bought or sold through a brokerage's internet-based proprietary trading platforms. The amount of tax required by this bill is one percent of each online stock transaction.

SECTION 3. The Internal Revenue Service will oversee the enforcement of this bill and will be given the power to provide immediate closure to any institution found in violation.

SECTION 4. This bill will go into implementation on February 1st, 2022.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Drone Strikes

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All U.S. agencies and entities are prohibited from pursuing drone strikes in foreign territory and shall immediately cease all current drone strikes.

SECTION 2. A drone strike is defined as a military attack performed by a digital aircraft or projectile weapon that is controlled remotely.

SECTION 3. This bill will be enforced by the Central Intelligence Agency and the U.S. Department of Defense.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect on March 1, 2021.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase the Minimum Wage

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The U.S. federal minimum hourly wage shall be increased from \$7.25 to
2 \$15.

3 **SECTION 2.** The federal minimum hourly wage is defined as the lowest per-hour wage
4 that a business is allowed to pay its employees, except in specific cases
5 outlined in federal law.

6 **SECTION 3.** This bill will be enforced by the U.S. Department of Labor.

7 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on March 1, 2021.

8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
