

A Bill to Promote Healthy Lunch Options

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** Schools will now be required to provide a mandatory
3 salad bar in their lunch lines and focus their physical
4 education curriculums on physical fitness.

5 **Section 2:** Mandatory salad bars shall be defined as sections of
6 counter designated for healthy foods like salad, vegetables,
7 and fruits.

8 **Section 3:** The Department of Education and Food and Drug
9 Administration will oversee the implementation of this bill. A.
10 The Department of Education will be responsible for
11 distributing funds. B. The Food and Drug Administration will be
12 responsible for overseeing health regulations and making sure
13 schools have an adequate amount of healthy foods in their salad
14 bars. C. Up to a \$3,000 fine will be put in place for schools
15 that do not comply. The amount will depend on their income.

16 **Section 4:** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of
17 the 2022/2023 school year.

18 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
19 declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Funding for NASA

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The United States shall double the funding of the
3 National Aeronautics and Space Administration NASA of \$19.5
4 Billion USD to \$39.1 Billion USD for the purpose of the
5 administration's goal of human exploration.

6 **Section 2:** "Human Exploration" shall be defined as expanding human
7 presence into the solar system and to the surface of Mars to
8 advance exploration, science, innovation, benefits to humanity,
9 and international collaboration.

10 **Section 3:** The Implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the
11 Congressional Budget Office in coordination with the Department
12 of Defense. A. All means of funding shall be allocated from the
13 United States Military Budget. B. The withdrawal and
14 implementation of funding should be set in a maximum time span
15 of 10 years.

16 **Section 4:** This law shall go into effect in the beginning of Fiscal
17 Year of 2025.

18 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
19 declared null and void.

A Bill to Eliminate College Tuition

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** All course tuition for two and four-year colleges and
3 technical schools in the United States is hereby eliminated.

4 **Section 2:** Four-year colleges shall be defined as an undergraduate
5 degree program that leads to a bachelor's degree in a specific
6 area of study. Technical schools shall be defined as a two-year
7 college that covers fields such as business, finance,
8 hospitality, tourism, construction, engineering, visual arts,
9 information technology and community work. Tuition shall be
10 defined as a sum of money charged for teaching or instruction
11 by a school, college, or university. Tuition does not include
12 meal plans, housing, or student fees.

13 **Section 3:** The Department of Education will oversee the
14 implementation of this bill.

15 **Section 4:** This legislation will take effect on August 1st, 2022.

16 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
17 declared null and void.
