

A Bill to Provide Paid Parental Leave

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The United States Federal Government will provide every
3 worker getting paid at least minimum wage, a minimum of six
4 weeks parental leave regardless of the gender or total income
5 of the parental figure. A parent shall receive one hour of
6 paid leave for each hour said parent typically work during a
7 standard week.

8 **Section 2:** Parental Leave or Family Leave is defined as an employee
9 benefit that provides job-protected leave from employment to
10 care for a child following its birth or adoption. Workers may
11 qualify for parental leave whether they are employed by a
12 business or self employed. The calculations for how many hours
13 of paid leave are given, will be determined by averaging the
14 past 52 weeks of employment. The total weeks used for the
15 calculations will only be less than 52 if the worker has not
16 been with the organization for a calendar year. In that
17 circumstance, the number will be calculated using all weeks of
18 employment.

19 **Section 3:** This legislation will be enforced by the Wage and Hour
20 Division of the United States Department of Labor.

21 **Section 4:** This legislation will go into effect at the beginning of
22 the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year.

23 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
24 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Medical Coverage for Student Athletes

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The NCAA must ensure that Intercollegiate Athletic
3 Programs at 4-year universities will be required to adhere to
4 the following: A. Athletic programs shall be responsible
5 for paying the insurance deductible amount applicable to the
6 claim of any student athlete who suffers an injury resulting
7 from their participation in the athletic program and makes a
8 claim relating to that injury. B. If a student athlete
9 suffers an injury resulting from their participation in the
10 athletic program that requires ongoing medical treatment, the
11 athletic program shall provide, for a minimum of two years
12 following the student athlete's graduation or separation from t
13 he school, the necessary medical treatment.

14 **Section 2:** Any university that does not adhere to the above
15 standards will lose 40% of their federal funding. The NCAA
16 will be charged a fine of \$10 million for each infraction, if
17 they don't enforce this law.

18 **Section 3:** The Department of Education in coalition with the
19 Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee the
20 implementation of this legislation.

21 **Section 4:** This legislation will be implemented July 1, 2022.

22 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
23 declared null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Omicron from Growing (POG)

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The United States Federal Government will enact a 90 day
3 travel ban to decrease the international spread of Omicron.

4 **Section 2:** A travel ban shall be defined as a universal stop on
5 commercial arrivals in the United States and departures from
6 the United States to all international locations.

7 **Section 3:** This legislation will be enforced and regulated by the
8 Federal Aviation Administration. If the FAA feels that an
9 extension is necessary after 90 days, they may do so if it is
10 deemed as needed.

11 **Section 4:** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon
12 passage and will run until March 18th, 2022.

13 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this policy
14 shall hereby be declared null and void.
