

A Bill to Study Aviator Cancer

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** This bill shall direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs
3 to seek to enter into an agreement with the National Academies
4 of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine to study the incidence
5 and mortality of cancer among individuals who served in the
6 Navy, Air Force, or Marine Corps as aircrew.

7 **Section 2:** The study shall test for no fewer than 10 types of
8 cancer that are of the greatest concern with respect to
9 exposure by covered individuals to the chemicals, compounds,
10 agents, and other phenomena.

11 **Section 3:** The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall oversee the
12 enforcement of the bill.

13 **Section 4:** This bill will take effect no later than 60 days after
14 being approved.

15 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
16 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Protect Charter Schools from Federal Overreach

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** This bill shall prohibit the Secretary of Education from
3 finalizing or implementing a rule submitted by the Secretary
4 relating to charter school programs, and for other purposes.

5 **Section 2:** The Secretary of Education may not finalize or otherwise
6 implement the rule submitted by the Secretary relating to
7 Proposed Priorities, Requirements, Definitions, and Selection
8 Criteria-Expanding Opportunity Through Quality Charter Schools
9 Program (CSP)-Grants to State Entities (SE Grants); Grants to
10 Charter Management Organizations for the Replication and
11 Expansion of High-Quality Charter Schools (CMO Grants); and
12 Grants to Charter School Developers for the Opening of New
13 Charter Schools and for the Replication and Expansion of
14 High-Quality Charter Schools (Developer Grants) or any
15 substantially similar rule.

16 **Section 3:** The Department of Education will oversee the enforcement
17 of the bill.

18 **Section 4:** This bill will take effect immediately after passing.

19 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
20 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Create Plain Prescription Prices

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** Direct-to-consumer television advertisements for
3 prescription drugs and biological products shall include
4 truthful and not misleading pricing information.

5 **Section 2:** Direct-to-consumer television is defined as broadcast,
6 cable, streaming, and satellite television.

7 **Section 3:** The Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting
8 through the Administrator of the Centers for Medicare &
9 Medicaid Services, shall promulgate regulations requiring each
10 for a prescription drug or biological product for which payment
11 is available under title XVIII or XIX of the Social Security
12 Act to include a textual statement, which shall be truthful and
13 not misleading, indicating the list price, as determined on the
14 first day of the quarter during which the advertisement is
15 being aired or otherwise broadcast, for a typical 30-day
16 regimen or typical course of treatment (whichever is most
17 appropriate).

18 **Section 4:** This bill shall go into effect January 1st, 2023.

19 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
20 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Aid for Countries Abetting Illegal Immigration

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The President may not provide assistance under the
3 Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 or any other Act and allocated
4 for a covered country for a fiscal year unless the President
5 determines and certifies to Congress that the country has
6 developed and implemented laws and policies that would cease
7 the flow of migrants through the country to the United States.

8 **Section 2:** The term covered country means El Salvador, Guatemala,
9 Honduras, Mexico, or Nicaragua.

10 **Section 3:** The Office of Foreign Assistance shall oversee the
11 enforcement of this bill.

12 **Section 4:** This Act takes effect on the date of the enactment of
13 this Act and applies with respect to amounts made available
14 under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 or any other Act for
15 fiscal year 2023 and each subsequent fiscal year.

16 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
17 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A National Holiday to Celebrate John Adams

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** Upon passage of this bill, the United States Federal
3 Government shall create a national holiday to celebrate John
4 Adams' efforts in democracy and bringing the USA into being.

5 **Section 2:** John Adam's birthday is October 30th. This day will be
6 a federally observed day; all federal buildings will be closed,
7 along with schools, libraries, and courts.

8 **Section 3:** In accordance with Title V code, this Congress has
9 authority to create federal holidays.

10 **Section 4:** This bill will take effect beginning January 1, 2023.

11 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
12 shall hereby be declared null and void.
