

A Bill to Ban Summer School

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The United States shall ban summer school in K-12
3 schools.

4 **Section 2:** Summer classes are defined as those outside the primary
5 academic year and are primarily used for credit recovery for
6 students who failed classes.

7 **Section 3:** The Department of Education in conjunction with various
8 Boards of Education will enforce this law.

9 **Section 4:** This legislation will go into effect starting in Summer
10 2023.

11 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
12 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Consumer Fuel Price Gouging

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** This bill prohibits any person from selling, during a
3 proclaimed energy emergency, a consumer fuel at a price that
4 (1) is unconscionably excessive, and (2) indicates that the
5 seller is exploiting the emergency to increase prices
6 unreasonably. Civil penalties collected by the commission
7 through such enforcement must be used to provide assistance
8 under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

9 **Section 2:** Emergencies shall be defined by The President of the
10 United States. The President may issue a proclamation of such
11 an emergency that specifies the consumer fuel and geographic
12 area covered and how long the proclamation applies.

13 **Section 3:** The Federal Trade Commission and state attorneys general
14 shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.

15 **Section 4:** This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage.

16 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
17 shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Ammend the Child Nutrition Act of 1966

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:**

2 **Section 1:** The Child Nutrition Act of 1966 shall be ammended to
3 establish waiver authority to address certain emergencies,
4 disasters, and supply chain disruptions.

5 **Section 2:** The term `emergency' means a period during which there
6 exists a public health emergency declared by the Secretary of
7 Health and Human Services under section 319 of the Public
8 Health Service Act or a presidentially declared major emergency
9 or disaster as defined under section 102 of the Robert T.
10 Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act. The
11 term `supply chain disruption' means a shortage of supplemental
12 foods that impedes the redemption of food instruments, as
13 determined by the Secretary of Agriculture.

14 **Section 3:** The U.S. Department of Agriculture will oversee the
15 enforcement of the bill.

16 **Section 4:** This bill shall go into effect immediately upon passage.

17 **Section 5:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
18 shall hereby be declared null and void.
