

A Bill to Privatize Amtrak

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. Section 1 The National Railroad Passenger Corporation, or
3. Amtrak, shall be privatized.
4. Section 2 Privatization of Amtrak is defined as changing from
5. governmental to private control and ownership through the
6. sale of preferred stock and de-federalizing the appointment
7. of Amtrak's board of directors. Amtrak's preferred stock
8. will be sellable upon passage of this bill and Amtrak's
9. Board of Directors managed by the corporation's owners.
10. Section 3 The Department of Transportation will oversee the
11. enforcement of this Bill, which is binding to all parties
12. in agreement to Section 1 and has the same effect as if
13. arrived at by agreement of the parties under the Railway
14. Labor Act.
15. Section 4 This bill shall go into effect on January 1st, 2024.
16. Section 5 All other laws that are in conflict with this new
17. policy shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Resolution to Promote Foreign Languages in Elementary School

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

1. WHEREAS, students rarely if ever remember foreign languages
2. with the current requirements; and
3. WHEREAS, studies have shown that languages are best learned at
4. an early age; and
5. WHEREAS, other competing foreign countries teach their
6. students at least one other language from an early age; and
7. WHEREAS, knowing multiple languages is beneficial in today's
8. job market; now, therefore,
9. RESOLVED, by the Student Congress here assembled that in
10. beginning the 2023 school year, all elementary school
11. should incorporate at least one foreign language into their
12. curriculum for all grades.

A Bill to Abolish ICE

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. Section 1 The U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)
3. will be abolished.
4. Section 2 Immigrants will only be denied entry into the US if
5. they are specifically labeled as a security threat to the US.
6. Section 3 The responsibilities of this agency will be laid
7. upon the Department of Homeland Security.
8. Section 4 Implementation will occur immediately upon passage.
9. Section 5 All other laws that are in conflict with this new
10. policy shall hereby be declared null and void.
