Eligibility & Entries:

Any regularly enrolled undergraduate in a two year or four-year college is eligible to participate if in good academic standing. Eligibility standards for AFA nationals will be enforced, and the tournament director reserves the right to ask a coach to prove that a student is eligible.

FORENSICSTOURNAMENT.NET IS THE PREFERRED METHOD OF REGISTRATION.

Double/Triple Entry:

Competitors may only enter IPDA debate OR IEs on Saturday.

A competitor may enter up to three individual events per conflict pattern, unless doing extemp. Contestants in extemp are limited to two events in Pattern A. Competitors that decide to double or triple enter are doing so at their own risk. Multiple entry can create hardships for competitors. It is the competitor's responsibility to check in to their rooms and perform within the allotted scheduled round time.

IPDA Debate:

Divisions: We plan to offer a single, open division of 1v1 IPDA debate.

We will use the 5-2-6-2-3-5-3 format with 30 minutes of prep time. We ask that competitors and critics defer to this link for additional rules and regulations: <http://www.ipdadebate.info>. All rounds are subject to IPDA rules unless otherwise noted.

Following the return of the ballot, critics may disclose as much or as little information as they see fit so long as it does not interfere with the tournament schedule. Delays caused by coaches/judges may, at the tournament director's discretion, result in penalties to that school's teams including removal from the tournament.

NOTE TO JUDGES: All rounds must have one winner and one loser. Topic Draw and Prep Topic draw will be conducted at a central location and will begin once all debaters are present. Debaters who are not present at the scheduled draw time may forfeit their ability to participate in topic strikes. Debaters assigned to the negative will be given first strike. Each debater will have 30 minutes of prep time. There will/will not be pre-assigned prep rooms.

Elimination Rounds:

IPDA: we will have two to three elimination rounds based on the number of entries. We will not offer more than three elimination rounds. Advancement to and seeding in elimination rounds will be first based upon wins, followed by total speaker points, followed by opposition record, then adjusted speaker points, and finally by ZScore. In elimination rounds, brackets will NOT be broken.

Individual Events - General:

The individual events offered are subject to the rules of the AFA National Individual Events Tournament.

Complete event descriptions are available on request. Two conflict patterns A & B will be offered in open division. Finals will follow two preliminary rounds with the top six advancing to finals. In the occurrence of a very small number of participants in an event, that event may go to two rounds and no finals.

Please watch for announcements concerning when finals for various events will take place as these will be adapted by the IE tab room for judge and room availability during the time allotted

in the schedule for finals. No speaker will be ranked lower than 4th in the preliminary rounds, but speakers will be ranked 1st through last in elimination rounds.

Awards:

Awards will be given for finalists and higher in individual events and all competitors who advance to elimination rounds in IPDA debate. The top three speakers will be awarded in IPDA debate.

Overall sweepstakes awards will be offered to the top school and top community college competing in both IPDA and Speech events.

Ties will be broken by the most number of first places in individual events, secondly by the school qualifying the most number of persons to elimination rounds of IEs or Debate, and finally by the flip of the coin. The top three teams in each division of debate per school or the top three persons in each individual event per school will count toward team sweepstakes.

Fees:

Individual Events: \$10 (one judge covers 6 slots)

Judging Fee Per Uncovered Individual Events: \$25

IPDA: \$25 (one judge covers four debaters)

Judging Fee Per Uncovered IPDA: \$75

Drops at Registration: \$25

Dropped Judges: \$100 each.

Note: Schools cannot be guaranteed that they will be able to enter more students than the judges they provide, but to the extent that judges can be hired, a fee of \$75 for uncovered IPDA competitors, and \$25 for each uncovered event in individual events will be charged. IE judging commitments are determined as a whole and not per conflict pattern.

Meal Fee (see Meal section below): one-time \$14 per competitor/coach/judge.

Fees will be assessed as of 5 pm, Wednesday, October 25th, and schools will be expected to pay fees as indicated by their entry at that time regardless of subsequent deletions. Drops after Wednesday will result in a \$20 fee.

Judging Obligations:

Judges should expect to judge at least up to their commitment and may be asked to judge one round beyond their commitment in order to ensure the best possible critics. All judges are expected to be available for the first elimination round of debate and one round beyond that in which their team is eliminated. Judges in individual events should expect to judge in both conflict patterns even if they have students entered in only one conflict pattern. *Because the IE*

and IPDA schedules conflict on Saturday, schools will need different judges to cover their team's debate and IE entries. However, judges should expect to be part of both IPDA and IE judging pools.

If your team can provide judges in excess of your commitment, we WOULD REALLY LIKE to either hire them for additional rounds or give a discount to the registration fees of the team. Consult Sarah if you are interested in this option.

Tournament Facilitation:

The tournament director reserves the right to make any decisions necessary to facilitate the timely and accurate completion of the tournament.

Campus Map/Tournament Buildings: All events, tab room, awards, and registration will take place in Tutt Library and Palmer Hall (circled in purple in the middle of the map).



Meals:

While campus is centrally located, there is limited time for meal breaks. To ease this challenge (and keep the tournament on time!), we are offering “meal packages” which can be added to your registration costs. Please note that on Saturday lunch will be available at Rastall Dining Hall on campus (circled in green on above map). Rastall’s has various options available, including vegan, vegetarian and gluten-free. You can even [check out their menu](#) in advance!

A meal fee will be charged at \$14 per student/coach/judge and cover lunch on Saturday, in addition to light breakfast fare and snacks, coffee, beverages, which will be available throughout the tournament.

Transportation & Parking:

If staying at a downtown hotel, please consider using the free ZEB shuttle, which travels along Tejon St. every 7-10 minutes, stopping on the westside of Robson arena (building #125, circled in yellow on map above, a 3-minute walk to/from Palmer Hall). Parking: Street parking on Cache La Poudre, Cascade, Nevada, and Weber (the yellow areas on the streets of the map above (or see [this map](#))) is free and requires no permit **all weekend**. Please note there is a hockey game on Saturday night at Robson Arena, which will affect parking on Cache La Poudre next to the arena. We strongly recommend parking on Nevada St. for Saturday’s tournament.
