

A Bill to Promote Renewable Energy in Public Schools

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** All public middle schools in the United States shall
2 install and utilize renewable energy sources, such as solar
3 panels or wind turbines, to meet at least 50% of their energy
4 needs by FY 2026.

5 **SECTION 2.** The term "renewable energy sources" refers to energy
6 sources that are replenished naturally on a human timescale,
7 including but not limited to solar, wind, hydroelectric, and
8 geothermal power.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education, in collaboration with
10 the Department of Energy, will oversee the enforcement of this
11 policy through the allocation of grants, regular inspections,
12 and progress monitoring.

13 A. Schools may apply for federal grants to cover the
14 initial costs of installation.

15 B. Schools failing to meet the 50% requirement by FY 2026
16 will be subject to penalties, including reduced federal
17 funding.

18 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025.
19 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
20 null and void.

A Resolution to Increase Federal Funding for Mental Health Services to Address the Mental Health Crisis

1 **WHEREAS**, The United States is facing a significant mental
2 health crisis, with increasing rates of depression, anxiety,
3 and other mental health disorders; and

4 **WHEREAS**, The current levels of federal funding are
5 insufficient to meet the growing demand for mental health
6 services, leading to a lack of accessible care for many
7 Americans; and

8 **WHEREAS**, The inadequacy of mental health services contributes
9 to escalated rates of homelessness, incarceration, and
10 emergency room visits, burdening other sectors of public
11 service; and

12 **WHEREAS**, Stigma and misunderstanding surrounding mental
13 health issues continue to hinder individuals from seeking the
14 help they need, exacerbating the public health crisis; now,
15 therefore, be it

16 **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled increase federal
17 funding for mental health services to ensure comprehensive
18 coverage, accessibility, and support for all Americans in
19 need; and, be it

20 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That such funding should support the
21 expansion of mental health facilities, training for mental
22 health professionals, and public awareness campaigns to
23 reduce stigma and promote mental wellness.

A Bill to Expand Public Transportation Networks

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** To reduce traffic congestion and carbon emissions,
3 federal funding will be increased by 25% for the expansion of
4 public transportation networks in cities across the United
5 States by FY 2026.

6 **SECTION 2.** "Public transportation networks" refer to
7 transportation systems available for use by the general
8 public, including buses, trains, subways, and trams.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Transportation will oversee the
10 allocation of funds and monitor the development and expansion
11 projects.

12 A. Cities must submit detailed plans and progress reports to
13 qualify for the increased funding.

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025.
15 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
16 declared null and void.

A Bill to Promote Nationwide Tree Planting Initiatives

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** A national initiative shall be established to
2 plant 100 million trees across the United States by FY 2030
3 to combat climate change and improve air quality.

4 **SECTION 2.** "Tree planting initiatives" include organized
5 efforts to plant trees in urban, suburban, and rural areas,
6 prioritizing native species and biodiversity.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Agriculture, in collaboration
8 with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), will
9 coordinate the initiative, partnering with local
10 governments, nonprofits, and community groups.

11 A. Participating organizations can receive federal grants
12 and resources to support their tree planting efforts.

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1,
14 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
15 declared null and void.

A Bill to Improve Internet Access in Rural Areas

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** To bridge the digital divide, broadband internet
2 access will be expanded to 95% of rural households in the
3 United States by FY 2026, ensuring high-speed connections.

4 **SECTION 2.** "Rural households" are defined as homes located in
5 areas classified as rural by the United States Census Bureau,
6 which currently lack access to broadband internet as defined
7 by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

8 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will
9 oversee this expansion, working with internet service
10 providers to extend infrastructure and services.

11 A. Providers participating in the expansion will receive tax
12 incentives and federal subsidies.

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025.
14 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
15 declared null and void.
