

## A Bill to Ban Single-Use Plastics in Schools

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The sale and use of single-use plastics, including

3. straws, utensils, and packaging, will be prohibited in all public

4. and private schools.

5. **Section 2** 'Single-use plastics' are defined as plastic products

6. that are used only once before they are thrown away or recycled.

7. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will oversee

8. the enforcement of this ban, providing guidelines for schools to

9. transition to sustainable alternatives.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of

11. the next academic year following its passage. All laws in

12. conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Designate October as National Pet Adoption Month

1. **WHEREAS**, Many pets in shelters across the country are in need of
2. loving homes; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Raising awareness about pet adoption can lead to more
4. shelter animals being adopted into caring families; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Promoting pet adoption can reduce the number of animals in
6. shelters and improve animal welfare; and
7. **WHEREAS**, A dedicated month for pet adoption can engage communities
8. and provide educational opportunities on responsible pet
9. ownership; now, therefore, be it
10. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled designates October as
11. National Pet Adoption Month; and, be it
12. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That events and programs promoting pet adoption
13. be supported and promoted by local and state governments along
14. with animal welfare organizations.

## A Resolution to Establish and Promote Annual Nationwide Youth Art Events

1. **WHEREAS**, Artistic expression is a crucial aspect of development and
2. learning for young individuals; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Many teens do not have access to sufficient artistic
4. outlets or platforms to showcase their work; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Nationwide youth art events can provide these
6. opportunities, fostering talent and cultural exchange; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Supporting such events can enhance community engagement
8. and appreciation for diverse artistic expressions; now,
9. therefore, be it
10. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled supports the creation
11. and promotion of annual nationwide youth art events.

## A Bill to Allocate Federal Funding for Youth Sports Programs

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Federal grants will be provided to local communities to  
3. develop and enhance youth sports programs.

4. **Section 2** 'Youth sports programs' include team sports such as  
5. soccer, basketball, baseball, and individual sports like swimming  
6. and athletics.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Health and Human Services, in  
8. collaboration with local school districts and community  
9. organizations, will administer these grants and monitor the  
10. implementation of sports programs.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect in the fiscal year  
12. following its passage, with annual reviews to assess program  
13. effectiveness. All laws in conflict with this legislation are  
14. hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Provide Free Public Wi-Fi**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Federal funding shall be allocated to establish and
3. maintain free public Wi-Fi networks in parks, libraries, and
4. other public spaces across the country.
5. **Section 2** 'Free public Wi-Fi' refers to wireless internet services
6. provided without charge to users in designated public areas.
7. **Section 3** The Federal Communications Commission (FCC), in
8. coordination with local governments, will oversee the
9. implementation and maintenance of these Wi-Fi networks.
10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect within six months
11. following its enactment. All laws in conflict with this
12. legislation are hereby declared null and void.
