

A Bill to Create of Community Sports Leagues

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Federal grants will be allocated to support the
3. establishment and maintenance of community sports leagues for
4. children aged 12 and under.

5. **Section 2** 'Community sports leagues' are defined as organized
6. sports activities managed by local community centers, schools, or
7. independent organizations that provide regular sporting events
8. for children.

9. **Section 3** The Department of Health and Human Services, in
10. collaboration with local communities, will oversee the
11. distribution of funds and provide resources to ensure the
12. sustainability and inclusivity of these leagues.

13. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of
14. the next fiscal year. All laws in conflict with this legislation
15. are hereby declared null and void.

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A Resolution to Promote Annual Science Fairs in Schools

1. **WHEREAS**, Engaging in scientific experiments and projects can
2. significantly enhance problem-solving skills and curiosity among
3. students; and
4. **WHEREAS**, Many schools lack the resources or initiative to organize
5. science fairs; and
6. **WHEREAS**, Annual science fairs can provide a platform for students
7. to showcase their creative and analytical talents; now,
8. therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled supports the
10. implementation of annual science fairs in all elementary and
11. middle schools; and, be it
12. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That schools receive federal assistance for
13. materials and resources necessary to conduct these events,
14. fostering a love of science and innovation from a young age.

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A Bill to Enhance Public Library Resources for Children

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Additional funding shall be provided to public libraries
3. specifically for the expansion and enhancement of children's
4. sections.

5. **Section 2** 'Children's sections' in libraries are designated areas
6. that cater to the educational and recreational needs of children
7. through books, multimedia resources, and learning activities.

8. **Section 3** The Institute of Museum and Library Services will oversee
9. the allocation of funds and ensure that libraries use these funds
10. to incorporate current technologies, a diverse range of books,
11. and interactive learning tools.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of
13. the next fiscal year. All laws in conflict with this legislation
14. are hereby declared null and void.

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A Bill to Launch a National Anti-Littering Campaign

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** A national anti-littering campaign shall be established
3. to promote environmental cleanliness and responsibility among
4. young people across the United States.

5. **Section 2** 'Anti-littering campaign' refers to a series of
6. educational and promotional activities designed to raise
7. awareness about the negative impacts of littering and to
8. encourage proper waste disposal habits.

9. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in
10. collaboration with the Department of Education, will oversee the
11. campaign, which will include: A. Distribution of educational
12. materials in schools. B. Organization of community clean-up
13. events. C. Public service announcements on television, radio,
14. and social media platforms.

15. **Section 4** The campaign will particularly target areas known for
16. high rates of littering, with efforts made to engage local
17. communities and youth organizations in clean-up and awareness
18. activities.

19. **Section 5** This legislation will take effect within six months
20. following its enactment, to allow for adequate planning and
21. resource allocation. All laws in conflict with this legislation
22. are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Plant More Trees in Cities

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** To make our cities greener and cleaner, a new rule will
3. be made to plant at least one million new trees in cities all
4. over the country by the year 2025.

5. **Section 2** "Trees" mean big plants with a single tall stem called a
6. trunk, branches, and leaves. They help make the air clean, give
7. shade, and make places look beautiful.

8. **Section 3** The Department of Parks and Recreation will help cities
9. plant these trees. They will pick the best types of trees that
10. are good for each city's weather and help take care of them so
11. they grow big and strong.

12. **Section 4** This law will start on July 1, 2024. All other laws that
13. are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared
14. null and void.
