A Bill to Create of Community Sports Leagues

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Federal grants will be allocated to support the
3. establishment and maintenance of community sports leagues for
4. children aged 12 and under.

5. **Section 2** 'Community sports leagues' are defined as organized
6. sports activities managed by local community centers, schools, or
7. independent organizations that provide regular sporting events
8. for children.

9. **Section 3** The Department of Health and Human Services, in
10. collaboration with local communities, will oversee the
11. distribution of funds and provide resources to ensure the
12. sustainability and inclusivity of these leagues.

13. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of
14. the next fiscal year. All laws in conflict with this legislation
15. are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Promote Renewable Energy Projects in High Schools

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Federal grants will be provided to high schools for the
3. development and installation of renewable energy projects, such
4. as solar panels and wind turbines.

5. **Section 2** The Department of Energy will oversee the grant program,
6. which aims to promote hands-on learning experiences in renewable
7. energy and environmental stewardship.

8. **Section 3** Participating schools must integrate these projects into
9. their science curricula and provide annual reports on energy
10. savings and educational outcomes.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of
12. the next academic year following its passage. All laws in
13. conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Establish a National Teen Mental Health Day

1. **WHEREAS**, Mental health issues among teenagers are a growing
2. concern; and
3. **WHEREAS**, There is a need to increase awareness and reduce the
4. stigma associated with seeking help for mental health issues; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Designating a day specifically for teen mental health can
6. highlight the importance of mental health education and support;
7. now, therefore, be it
8. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled designates May 1st as
9. National Teen Mental Health Day; and, be it
10. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That schools, communities, and health
11. organizations are encouraged to observe this day with activities
12. and programs that promote understanding and support for teen
13. mental health.

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A Bill to Enhance Entrepreneurial Support for Young Adults

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** A national entrepreneurship support program will be
3. created to provide start-up grants, low-interest loans, and
4. mentorship opportunities to young adults who are launching new
5. businesses.

6. **Section 2** 'Young entrepreneurs' are defined as individuals aged 20
7. to 30 who are starting or have recently started a new business
8. venture.

9. **Section 3** The Small Business Administration (SBA) will administer
10. the program, partnering with experienced business leaders and
11. institutions to offer guidance and support to program
12. participants.

13. **Section 4** The program aims to foster innovation, create jobs, and
14. stimulate economic growth by empowering young adults to turn
15. their business ideas into reality.

16. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect within six months from
17. its passage, allowing time for the SBA to establish guidelines
18. and application procedures. All laws in conflict with this
19. legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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A Bill to Subsidize Internet Access for Low-Income Families

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** A subsidy program will be established to provide
3. affordable internet access to low-income families with teenage
4. children.

5. **Section 2** The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will
6. administer this program, ensuring that families have the
7. necessary resources to support their children's educational needs.

8. **Section 3** Eligibility for this program will be determined based on
9. income, with priority given to families most in need of financial
10. assistance.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect six months after its
12. passage, allowing time for the FCC to establish guidelines and
13. application procedures. All laws in conflict with this
14. legislation are hereby declared null and void.
