

## A Resolution to Promote Access to Clean Drinking Water in Public Parks

1. **WHEREAS**, Many public parks lack accessible and clean drinking water
2. stations; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Encouraging the use of refillable water bottles can reduce
4. plastic waste; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Installing refill stations will promote hydration and
6. environmental responsibility; now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourages local
8. governments to install water bottle refill stations in public
9. parks.

## A Bill to Increase Awareness About Animal Adoptions

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All publicly funded animal shelters must organize monthly  
3. adoption awareness events to educate the community about the  
4. benefits of adopting pets.

5. **Section 2** 'Adoption awareness events' include presentations, pet  
6. meet-and-greets, and distribution of educational materials.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Agriculture will oversee this  
8. initiative to ensure all shelters meet the monthly event  
9. requirement.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All  
11. laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null  
12. and void.

## The School Uniforms Act

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All public K-12 educational institutions in the United  
3. States shall require students to wear school uniforms.

4. **Section 2** A "school uniform" is defined as a standardized set of  
5. clothing, which must be worn by all students enrolled in public  
6. K-12 educational institutions. This uniform primarily consists of  
7. a top (shirt or blouse) and a bottom (pants or skirt), adhering  
8. to the specific color and design standards set forth by each  
9. educational institution.

10. **Section 3** Public K-12 educational institutions may apply for  
11. federal grants to assist low-income families in obtaining the  
12. required school uniforms.

13. **Section 4** Public K-12 educational institutions are responsible for  
14. establishing clear guidelines on the required school uniforms,  
15. including acceptable variations to accommodate changes in  
16. weather, religious beliefs, and disabilities.

17. **Section 5** SECTION 5. The first violation by an educational  
18. institution of the uniform policy will result in a notice and a  
19. period of 60 days to comply. Subsequent violations will lead to  
20. a decrease in federal educational funding to the institution by  
21. 10% for each violation, assessed annually.

22. **Section 6** This legislation shall be enforced by the United States  
23. Department of Education, which will also provide guidelines for  
24. the implementation of school uniform policies and monitor  
25. compliance.

26. **Section 7** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2025. All  
27. laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null  
28. and void.
