The Bring Americans Earnings (BAE) Act of 2024

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** The United States Federal Government shall hereby
3. legalize all forms of gambling with no restrictions.
4. **Section 2** All forms of gambling shall include: Casinos, Lottery,
5. Sports Betting, and Online Gambling. Specific Casino games
6. include poker, roulette, and other forms of physical commercial
7. gambling. Sports betting will be defined as the act of predicting
8. and placing a wager on the outcome of sporting events. This
9. applies to both digital and physical sports betting and both
10. college and professional sports.
11. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission will oversee the
12. implementation of this legislation. The Department of Justice
13. will oversee fair play. State Governments are also responsible
14. for implementing this legislation in their respective states.
15. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025
16. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
17. declared null and void.

A Bill to Forgive Federal Student Loans for Public Service Careers

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Federal student loans will be forgiven for individuals

3. who work in public service careers for a minimum of five

4. consecutive years.

5. **Section 2** 'Public service careers' include jobs in education,

6. government, non-profits, law enforcement, and public healthcare.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Education will oversee the loan

8. forgiveness program and ensure applicants meet the five-year

9. requirement.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect in FY 2026. All laws

11. in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and

12. void.

6. now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled directs the Department
8. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to conduct a comprehensive
9. study on the causes of rising rent and propose measures to
10. mitigate the issue; and, be it
11. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the government provide incentives for
12. developers to create affordable housing in urban areas to
13. address the growing rent crisis.
