

A Bill to Ban Non-Compete Agreements

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Non-compete agreements in employment contracts shall be
3. prohibited in the United States.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill 'non-compete agreements'
5. are clauses in employment contracts that restrict employees from
6. working for competitors or starting similar businesses within a
7. specified period after leaving a job.

8. **Section 3** The Department of Labor shall oversee enforcement of this
9. legislation. Employers found using non-compete agreements after
10. the effective date will be fined \$10,000 per violation.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect in FY2025.

12. **Section 5** ll laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
13. declared null and void.

A Resolution to Limit the Use of Subscription Models in Essential Software

1. **WHEREAS**, Subscription-based pricing for essential software has
2. created significant financial burdens for individuals and
3. businesses; and
4. **WHEREAS**, Perpetual subscription models often prevent users from
5. owning the tools they rely on for long-term productivity; and
6. **WHEREAS**, A lack of viable alternatives consolidates power in the
7. hands of a few major corporations, stifling competition and
8. innovation; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourage the Federal
10. Trade Commission to investigate the fairness of
11. subscription-based pricing in essential software markets.

A Bill to Prohibit Corporate-Owned Farmland

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Corporations, both domestic and foreign, shall be
3. prohibited from purchasing or owning farmland in the United States.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Corporations are
5. defined as entities registered as legal corporate structures,
6. including LLCs, partnerships, and multinational organizations. B.
7. Farmland refers to land used primarily for agricultural
8. production, as defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

9. **Section 3** The Department of Agriculture will enforce this
10. legislation. A. Farmland found in corporate possession after the
11. effective date must be divested within two years or transferred
12. to private ownership. B. Violations will result in a fine equal
13. to 20% of the assessed value of the farmland per year of
14. non-compliance.

15. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect in FY2027.

16. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
17. declared null and void.
