

A Bill to Ban the Sale of Exotic Pets

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** The sale of exotic animals as pets shall be banned in the
3. United States.
4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Exotic animals include
5. species that are not normally domesticated, such as monkeys,
6. snakes, parrots, and wild cats. B. Animals already owned before
7. this law takes effect may remain with their owners but may not be
8. sold or bred.
9. **Section 3** The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will enforce this law.
10. Sellers who break the law will be fined \$5,000 for each animal
11. sold.
12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Warning Labels on Sugary Drinks

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All sugary drinks sold in the United States must include
3. a warning label about the health risks of too much sugar.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Sugary drinks include
5. sodas, energy drinks, and fruit-flavored drinks with added
6. sugar. B. The warning label must clearly state: "Drinking too
7. much sugar can lead to health problems like obesity and diabetes."

8. **Section 3** The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) will enforce this
9. law. Any company that sells sugary drinks without the label will
10. be fined \$2,000 per day.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

12. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
13. declared null and void.
