

**A Bill to Classify Space Debris as an
International Hazard**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The United States shall recognize space debris as a
3. global environmental threat and commit to regulating its creation
4. and cleanup.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Space debris refers to
6. any human-made object in orbit around Earth that no longer serves
7. a useful function, including defunct satellites, rocket parts,
8. and collision fragments. B. Regulating its creation includes
9. mandating spacecraft manufacturers to have end-of-life disposal
10. plans for all launches.

11. **Section 3** NASA and the Department of Defense will jointly lead a
12. task force on space debris. A. The task force shall develop an
13. international treaty proposal by FY2027. B. U.S. companies
14. launching into orbit must comply with new debris reduction
15. protocols within 18 months of enactment.

16. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

17. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
18. declared null and void.

**A Resolution to End Federal Subsidies for
Industrial Meat Production**

1. **WHEREAS**, Industrial meat production is a major contributor to
2. greenhouse gas emissions, water pollution, and deforestation; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Federal subsidies artificially lower the cost of meat
4. while encouraging unsustainable environmental practices; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Transitioning to more sustainable farming methods would
6. benefit long-term public health and climate resilience; now,
7. therefore, be it
8. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled call for the elimination
9. of federal subsidies for large-scale industrial meat producers.
10. Introduced for Congressional Debate by NOF.

A Bill to Ban the Commercial Use of Brainwave Monitoring Technology Without Consent

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The commercial use of brainwave-monitoring devices or
3. software on individuals without their explicit, informed consent
4. shall be prohibited in the United States.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Brainwave-monitoring
6. technology refers to devices or software capable of measuring
7. neurological signals, including EEG headsets and AI
8. neuro-analysis tools. B. Commercial use includes marketing,
9. employee surveillance, product testing, and consumer behavior
10. tracking.

11. **Section 3** The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the Food
12. and Drug Administration (FDA) will jointly enforce this
13. legislation. A. Violators will face fines of up to \$500,000 per
14. instance. B. Repeat offenses may result in a ban on product
15. distribution within the U.S.

16. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

17. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
18. declared null and void.
