

A Bill to Classify Space Debris as an International Hazard

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The United States shall recognize space debris as a
3. global environmental threat and commit to regulating its creation
4. and cleanup.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Space debris refers to
6. any human-made object in orbit around Earth that no longer serves
7. a useful function, including defunct satellites, rocket parts,
8. and collision fragments. B. Regulating its creation includes
9. mandating spacecraft manufacturers to have end-of-life disposal
10. plans for all launches.

11. **Section 3** NASA and the Department of Defense will jointly lead a
12. task force on space debris. A. The task force shall develop an
13. international treaty proposal by FY2027. B. U.S. companies
14. launching into orbit must comply with new debris reduction
15. protocols within 18 months of enactment.

16. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

17. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
18. declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Algorithmic Pricing in Online Shopping

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Online retailers shall be banned from using dynamic
3. pricing algorithms that adjust prices based on user data or
4. browsing history.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Dynamic pricing
6. algorithms are systems that automatically change the price of a
7. product based on the user's location, device, or past
8. behavior. B. Online retailers include any company selling
9. products or services through a website or app.

10. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will enforce this
11. law. Retailers using such systems will face fines of \$50,000 per
12. violation.

13. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

14. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
15. declared null and void.

A Resolution to Ban Animal Testing for Cleaning Products

1. **WHEREAS**, Many cleaning products are tested on animals in ways that
2. cause them pain and suffering; and
3. **WHEREAS**, There are other safe ways to test these products without
4. hurting animals; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Some companies already make cleaning products without
6. animal testing; now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support a ban on animal
8. testing for cleaning products in the United States.
