The Griffin Tournament offers your students:

Saturday, Nov. 9th

- **A One-Day Individual Events Tournament, with 2 rounds and finals** in Open and Novice Divisions (if entries warrant). **Students are allowed to triple enter, except in Extemp. and Duo (double entry only).** This allows your students to complete all their individual events in one day, including finals and awards.
- Our "Picket Fence" Award: A special trophy for the student with a "picket fence" in individual events.
- A One-Day NPDA Parli Tournament. Novice, Junior & Open Divisions, if entries warrant. NPDA conflicts with Individual events, so you must choose between the two tournaments. 4 rounds of NPDA, with two out rounds of Bronze and Silver/Gold.

Sunday, Nov. 10th :

- **A One-Day IPDA Tournament, with Open, Junior and Novice Divisions (if entries warrant).** We will be using the 4 preliminary rounds and Bronze, Silver/Gold rounds model.
- An Overall Sweepstakes Award for the top three colleges in both Individual Events and Debate will be awarded during the final ceremony on Sunday.
- Great food for the judges, so they won't be too hungry to judge!

We look forward to seeing you at the Griffin Invitational Tournament, at Grossmont College.

EVENTS AND RULES:

Individual Events & IPDA:

11 individual events will be offered, in Open and Novice Divisions, if entries warrant.
Impromptu will be 3 quotations, not AFA style.

PATTERN "A" Extemp, Informative, Poetry, Prose, STE.

PATTERN "B" Impromptu, Duo, Persuasion, P.O.I., Drama, CA.

PLEASE NOTE: Individual Event competitors may enter 3 events per pattern, except for those entered in **Extemp. or Duo. Extempers and Duo may not triple enter.** Anyone entering 3 events per pattern, run the risk of missing a round and if you miss a round due to being triple entered you will forfeit that round.

Novice Division I.E.'s

A student who has not won two trophies (1st, 2nd, or 3rd Place) in an event in which a final round occurred. Students competing in an event which is similar; must be novice in all of those similar events. (Platform, Interp., Limited Prep). As an example; a student who is in Open Division in Prose, must also be open in Poetry, even if they have never competed in Poetry. Anyone who has won a Gold, Silver or Bronze at Phi Rho Pi is not a novice. Significant,

previous high school participation is also not a novice competitor, although coaches judgement is allowed.

Open Division I.E's

Any undergraduate in a two-year or four-year college may compete in open division.

"THE PICKET FENCE AWARD": The purpose of this award is to recognize a student who ranks first in all their preliminary and final rounds of competition in an individual event (5 first places). Traditionally, a student is recognized for this achievement by an announcement at the awards ceremony or by the individual's coach. The Griffin Speech Tournament awards this student with that recognition, as well as with a special "award".

- Grossmont students may compete at the tournament. They will not be eligible for sweepstakes points or the "picket fence award".
- No material used in competition shall have been used by the student in intercollegiate competition prior to September 1, 2024.

JUDGING:

Electronic Balloting

Electronic balloting will be used for IPDA, NPDA, and IEs. Judges are required to have a phone, tablet, or laptop capable of receiving emails to qualify as judges. Please bring a charger. When signing up judges on forensicstournament.net, please be sure to supply a telephone number and email address for each judge.

Judging Commitment: Judges must remain at the tournament one round beyond the elimination of their last participant. (All judges are committed to judge the first elimination round)

IPDA RULES:

We will offer Novice, Junior & Varsity divisions for IPDA. if entries warrant.

Eligibility Differences:

Novices are allowed to be in 8 or fewer tournaments including this one and also including their high school experience.

Juniors may have competed in up to 16 tournaments including this one and high school competition.

Senior division are for those with a desire to go senior, or who must move up due to 16 prior tournaments. This means all formats of debate, not just IPDA. And any college student enrolled in a degree may compete.

Judging Differences: IPDA could be judged by any critic at least 18 years old regardless of experience or credential. Some IPDA critics may have little to no experience, so debaters should thoroughly explain concepts and weigh impacts in the round.

Stylistic Differences: Cleaner, clearer speaking styles seem to work better than quicker, tech or higher speed styles for many traditional IPDA judges. Avoid gamey, techy tactics.

NPDA (Parliamentary Debate): IMPORTANT CHANGES IN PROCEDURES AT THIS TOURNAMENT, PLEASE READ THROUGH TO THE END!)

We will offer Novice, Junior and Senior (if entries warrant).

4 rounds of NPDA will be offered with 2 out rounds. Bronze, Silver, and Gold will be awarded.

NOVICE DIVISION PARLI:

A team consisting of students in their first 2 semesters of competition and neither team member has advanced to an out round twice. If either team member has competed in two out rounds, they must be advanced to Junior division. Students with significant high school or home school team policy, LD, Parli, Ted Turner, or other similar formats of debate, should be advanced to Junior division) Although, coaches discretion is allowed. Eligibility violations will result in the removal of that team from the tournament.

JUNIOR DIVISION PARLI:

Junior debaters may have up to 4 semesters of college debate and should not have advanced to more than two out rounds in Junior competition.

OPEN DIVISION

Open debaters are limited to students with 10 or fewer semesters of collegiate competition.

Any debater that has advanced to the elimination rounds at NPDA Nationals is considered an Open Division debater, regardless of the partner's experience. Eligibility is determined based upon the most experienced partner. A semester means the student has competed in three or more tournaments of any style of debate.

CHANGES TO PROCEDURES AT THIS TOURNAMENT FOR PARLI (NPDA) DEBATE:

Dear coaches, judges and competitors:

Our PSCFA Region has recently (Sept 2024) passed a number of new rules for PSCFA Tournaments, mostly pertaining to NPDA Debate, but since some also impact IPDA, I wanted to address those here. PSCFA, for those of you outside the region, is a regional group of programs that runs four tournaments a year (Warm Up, Fall Champs, Spring Champs and Cool Off). Their rules would govern those tournaments.

I have chosen to abide by our new rules for PSCFA in regards to Parliamentary Debate at this tournament. I've also mirrored some practices from Phi Rho Pi for Parli. I understand that this will be a learning process for many coaches/judges and competitors. I do believe it will bring back more competitors to Parli debate, so I hope many of you will try these "original" rules of Parli debate that have been brought back. Here they are:

- **Coaching:** No coaching allowed for Parli Debate. (Coaching still allowed for IPDA)
- **Topic striking:** We will be using 5 resolutions to select from in the room with the judge. There will be 2 policy, 2 value and 1 fact per round for the competitors to select from. As soon as the competitors have selected their topic, the 20 minutes prep time should begin.

- **Flex Time:** Remove flex time from Parli times. Therefore, we should see more Points of Information used during the debates. The rule should be that the first and last minute of each constructive speech is in protected time, but then the competitor may interrupt the speaker by saying: "Point of Information" and ask one question. POI's are not allowed during rebuttals, only point of order or personal privilege.
- **Laptops:** No laptops for flowing, or anything else in debate rounds, this is for all debates.
Judges can flow NPDA rounds on laptops and work on their electronic ballots, but Nothing else.

Please enjoy these new styles and also be respectful to those that may not have heard about the changes. No coaching, or laptops should be followed, but learning to use POI's and topic striking will take a little more practice.

SWEEPSTAKES INFORMATION

IE Sweepstakes:

10 points First
8 points 2nd
6 points 3rd
4 points finalist

NPDA, IPDA:

Each preliminary win = 5 points for NPDA,
4 points for IPDA preliminary win (regardless of how many teams in a division).
Teams earning less than 2 wins in NPDA and IPDA debate receive no sweepstakes points.
5 additional points for each team advancing to the initial elimination round for NPDA and TPDA,
with 4 points for IPDA (regardless of how many teams advance per division).

Parli - only 2-2 teams count and your four best teams per division. Non-winning record teams wins do not count towards sweepstakes. Each team that earns a win gets 3 points for every win. Regardless of division, for each advancing team that makes it to ELIM 1 regardless if they win or not, earn 3.0 points for each win.
Therefore an undefeated team that advances to Elim 1 can earn up to 15 debate sweepstakes points (4-0 which is 12 points + another 3 points for advancing to Elim 1)
