

A Bill to Ban the Use of Wild Animals in Circus Performances

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The use of wild animals in circus performances shall be
3. prohibited in the United States.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Wild animals include
5. lions, tigers, elephants, bears, and other non-domesticated
6. species. B. Circus performances refer to traveling shows or
7. events that use animals for entertainment.

8. **Section 3** The Department of Agriculture shall oversee enforcement
9. of this legislation. Circuses found using wild animals will be
10. fined \$10,000 for each performance.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

12. **Section 5** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
13. shall hereby be declared null and void.

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A Bill to Ban Glitter That Harms the Environment

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The sale of non-biodegradable plastic glitter shall be
3. banned in the United States.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Non-biodegradable

5. plastic glitter refers to tiny plastic particles used for

6. decoration that do not break down naturally in the

7. environment. B. Biodegradable alternatives such as plant-based

8. glitter will still be allowed.

9. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will oversee

10. enforcement of this law. Companies that continue to sell plastic

11. glitter will face a \$5,000 fine per violation.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby

14. declared null and void.
