

A Bill to Establish a "Right to Repair" for Electronics

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All electronics manufacturers must allow consumers and
3. independent repair shops to repair their products without
4. restriction.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Right to repair refers
6. to the ability of consumers to fix or modify their purchased
7. electronic devices without voiding warranties or losing
8. functionality. B. Electronics manufacturers include companies
9. that produce smartphones, computers, tablets, and other digital
10. devices.

11. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) shall oversee
12. enforcement. A. Companies that refuse to provide necessary
13. repair tools, manuals, or parts shall be fined up to \$100,000
14. per violation. B. Consumers shall retain full ownership rights
15. over devices they purchase, including the right to modify
16. software.

17. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

18. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
19. declared null and void.

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A Resolution to Limit the Use of Private Prisons

1. **WHEREAS**, Private prisons profit from incarceration, creating a
2. financial incentive to keep more people in prison; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Studies show that private prisons often cut costs in ways
4. that result in worse conditions for inmates; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Criminal justice should focus on rehabilitation and
6. fairness rather than corporate profits; now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourage the federal
8. government to phase out the use of private prisons for housing
9. inmates.

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A Bill to Establish a Federal Data Privacy Act

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** A comprehensive federal data privacy law shall be
3. established to regulate the collection, storage, and use of
4. personal data by corporations and online platforms operating in
5. the United States.

6. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Personal data includes
7. any information that can identify an individual, such as names,
8. addresses, phone numbers, biometric data, and online browsing
9. history. B. Corporations and online platforms refer to businesses
10. that collect or process user data for commercial purposes,
11. including social media companies, e-commerce sites, and
12. advertising firms.

13. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) shall oversee
14. enforcement of this law. A. Companies must obtain explicit user
15. consent before collecting or selling personal data. B. Users
16. shall have the right to access, correct, and request the
17. deletion of their personal data. C. Companies found in violation
18. shall be fined up to 5% of their annual global revenue per
19. offense.

20. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

21. **Section 5** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
22. shall hereby be declared null and void.
