

A Resolution to Limit Government Use of Predictive Policing

1. **WHEREAS**, Predictive policing uses data to guess where crimes might
2. happen or who might commit them; and
3. **WHEREAS**, This technology has been shown to unfairly target certain
4. neighborhoods or racial groups; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Relying on prediction rather than evidence raises
6. questions about fairness and privacy; now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled discourage the use of
8. predictive policing tools until stronger oversight and anti-bias
9. protections are in place.

A Bill to Ban the Use of Deepfake Videos in Political Campaigns

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The use of deepfake videos in political campaigns shall
3. be banned in the United States.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Deepfake videos are
5. digitally altered videos that realistically replace a person's
6. face or voice with someone else's using artificial
7. intelligence. B. Political campaigns include any public
8. communication supporting or opposing a candidate for public office.

9. **Section 3** The Federal Election Commission (FEC) will oversee
10. enforcement. Any campaign using a deepfake video will be fined
11. \$100,000 and required to take the video down within 24 hours.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.
