

A Bill to Regulate Private Ownership of Genetic Editing Tools

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Private individuals and corporations shall be prohibited
3. from owning or operating genetic editing tools capable of
4. altering human DNA without federal licensing.

5. **Section 2** Genetic editing tools include CRISPR-based systems and
6. any technology capable of making targeted changes to human
7. genetic material.

8. **Section 3** The National Institutes of Health (NIH) will oversee
9. licensing and enforcement. Entities found in violation will lose
10. access to federal research funding and face fines of up to
11. \$1,000,000.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2027.

13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Hidden Fees in Online Shopping

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Online retailers shall be prohibited from adding hidden
3. fees—including service fees, convenience fees, or automatic
4. add-ons—during the checkout process without displaying them
5. clearly on the first product page.
6. **Section 2** Hidden fees are charges that do not appear until checkout
7. and are not included in the initial advertised price.
8. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will enforce this law.
9. Retailers who violate it will be fined \$5,000 per transaction.
10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.

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A Bill to Ban Phone Use While Walking in Crosswalks

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** It shall be illegal to use a mobile phone or wear
3. headphones while crossing the street in a marked crosswalk.
4. **Section 2** The law applies to all pedestrians over the age of 10.
5. Emergency calls are exempt from this rule.
6. **Section 3** Local law enforcement agencies will issue warnings for
7. first offenses and \$25 fines for repeat offenses.
8. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
9. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
10. declared null and void.
