A Bill to Create a Universal Basic Income Pilot Program

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The United States shall establish a universal basic
3. income (UBI) pilot program in five states, providing \$1,000 per
4. month to every adult resident regardless of income or employment
5. status.

6. **Section 2** Universal basic income (UBI) refers to guaranteed,
7. unconditional cash payments provided by the government to
8. individuals.

9. **Section 3** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will
10. administer the pilot program. A. The program will last for five
11. years and be evaluated annually. B. Funding will come from
12. reallocating a portion of federal tax credits and subsidies.

13. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

14. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
15. declared null and void.

A Resolution to Phase Out Private Ownership of Military-Grade Weapons

1. **WHEREAS**, Civilian ownership of military-grade weapons, such as
2. automatic rifles and high-capacity magazines, has contributed to
3. mass shootings and increased public safety risks; and
4. **WHEREAS**, The presence of such weapons in civilian hands challenges
5. law enforcement's ability to maintain public order; and
6. **WHEREAS**, The Second Amendment guarantees the right to bear arms,
7. but reasonable regulation has been upheld as constitutional; now,
8. therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support a gradual
10. phase-out of private civilian ownership of military-grade
11. weapons, with government buy-back programs to reduce public
12. stockpiles.

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A Bill to Establish Carbon Tariffs on Imported Goods

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** A federal carbon tariff shall be imposed on all imported
3. goods produced in countries without strong environmental
4. protections.

5. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Carbon tariff means an
6. added tax on imported goods based on the carbon emissions created
7. during their production. B. Strong environmental protections
8. refers to nations with standards comparable to U.S. Environmental
9. Protection Agency (EPA) benchmarks.

10. **Section 3** The Department of Commerce, in coordination with the
11. EPA, shall oversee enforcement. A. Funds collected from the
12. tariff will be invested in renewable energy and climate
13. resilience programs. B. Trade agreements may be renegotiated to
14. accommodate nations impacted by the tariffs.

15. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

16. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
17. declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Cashless-Only Businesses

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Businesses in the United States shall not refuse cash as
3. a form of payment.

4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill, businesses include any
5. retail store, restaurant, or service provider that accepts
6. payment from customers.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Commerce will oversee enforcement. Any
8. business refusing to accept cash will face a \$500 fine per
9. violation.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.

A Bill to Restrict AI Voice Cloning Without Consent

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** No company or individual may create or distribute an
3. AI-generated voice clone of a person without their consent.
4. **Section 2** AI-generated voice clone means any artificial recording
5. that imitates a real person's voice using computer software.
6. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will enforce this law.
7. Anyone who creates or uses a voice clone without consent will be
8. fined \$25,000 per violation.
9. **Section 4** his legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
10. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
11. declared null and void.
