1. **WHEREAS**, Advertisements cover many public buses and can change the
2. appearance of public spaces; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Cities earn money by allowing businesses to advertise on
4. buses; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Some advertisements may promote products that are
6. unhealthy or inappropriate for children; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Limiting advertisements could require cities to find other
8. ways to pay for public transportation; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourage cities to
10. limit the amount of advertising displayed on public buses.

## A Bill to Require a National Maximum Speed Limit

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** No highway in the United States may have a speed limit
3. higher than 70 miles per hour.
4. **Section 2** States may set lower speed limits based on road
5. conditions, traffic, or safety concerns.
6. **Section 3** The Department of Transportation will enforce this
7. legislation by making compliance a requirement for receiving
8. federal highway funding.
9. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2027.
10. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
11. declared null and void.

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**A Bill to Make Election Day a Federal Holiday**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Election Day for federal elections shall become a federal
3. holiday.
4. **Section 2** Election Day occurs on the Tuesday after the first Monday
5. in November during federal election years.
6. **Section 3** The Office of Personnel Management will oversee
7. implementation of this legislation for federal government offices
8. and employees.
9. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2027.
10. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
11. declared null and void.
