

A Resolution Advocating Water Regulation in Southern California

1. Whereas, the average California family uses approximately 500 gallons of water
2. every day, and
3. Whereas, Southern California has to import almost of its water, and
4. Whereas, there is only a certain amount of water in the world, and
5. Whereas, people waste gallons of water for recreational use every day, and
6. Whereas, regulation of recreational water use in Southern California would allow future
7. generations to access water sources to live and several other benefits, therefore,
8. BE IT RESOLVED by the Student Congress here assembled that the California state
9. government mandate regulations on recreational water use.

A Resolution to Hybridize America

1. WHEREAS, The use of cars running purely on fossil fuels is drastically increasing our
2. dependence on oil; and
3. WHEREAS, By relying solely on cars that utilize fossil fuels, Americans are
4. perpetuating the demand for oil and depleting the supply; and
5. WHEREAS, Gas prices in the United States are increasing, as well as the consumption
6. of oil by individuals; and
7. WHEREAS, The use of Hybrid cars would decrease the total dependence on oil by at
8. least 20 percent; and
9. WHEREAS, Hybrids can run on alternative fuels, decreasing our dependency on fossil
10. fuels, and increasing the fuel options; now, therefore, be it
11. RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled require the Federal Government to
12. mandate that car manufacturers cease all production of automobiles that run solely on
13. fossil fuels.

Food Labeling: Genetically Engineered Food

1. Whereas, The Sherman Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Law makes it unlawful to
2. manufacture, sell, deliver, or offer for sale, any food that is misbranded, and
3. Whereas, Food is misbranded if its labeling does not conform to specified federal
4. and food allergens, and
5. Whereas, violation of this law is a misdemeanor,
6. Be it Resolved by this Student Congress tat legislation be enacted to require the
7. labeling of all genetically engineered fish entering and sold within the state.

China Democracy Promotion Act of 2011

1. Whereas, Human Rights Watch, Amnesty International, and Freedom House all
2. list the People's Republic of China as a grave abuser of human rights,
3. Whereas, China commits grave abuses such as forced abortions through the One
4. Child policy, high numbers of executions, and the jailing of political dissidents,
- and
5. Whereas, free exercise of religion is nonexistent with a government ban on
6. Roman Catholicism,
7. Therefore Be it Resolved that the President may exercise the authority under
8. section 212(f) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(f)) to deny
9. the entry into the United States of any alien who through his or her business
10. dealings with senior leadership of the Government of the People's Republic of

11. China participates in the implementation or execution of policies or actions,

1. including human rights abuses, that undermine or injure human rights or impede
2. the transition to democracy in the People's Republic of China.
