

A Bill for Native American Tribal Representation in the House

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Each Native American tribe shall have a representative in the House of
3 Representatives.

4 **SECTION 2.** A tribe shall be defined as a traditional Native American group living on a
5 reservation and recognized as such by the United States' Bureau of Indian
6 Affairs.

7 **SECTION 3.** Each tribe will determine a means of selecting a single representative to
8 the House of Representatives, be it through election, appointment, or
9 any other means it sees fit.

10 **SECTION 4.** This law shall take effect upon the opening of the 114th United States
11 Congress, in January 2015.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Enforce Requirements for Restaurants to Provide Accurate Nutritional Facts

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All restaurants in the U.S. will be required to provide accurate nutrition facts to consumers upon request.

SECTION 2. A. Restaurants shall be defined as any business/establishment where food is served to consumers.

B. Nutrition facts shall be defined as specific ingredient labeling, any nutrition content claims, certain content health messages, and other information required on a regular food label.

SECTION 3. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) will be responsible for the implementation and enforcement of this bill. Furthermore,

A. Restaurants that fail to comply with the requirement will have their Health Department Ratings lowered substantially and a fine of up to 15% of the total profit of the establishment that year shall be levied.

B. The nutrition facts must be checked and proven that it complies with specific FDA requirements, the NLEA, and FFDCA.

SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect directly after passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Raise the Driving Age

1 Be it enacted by this congress that:

2 **Section 1:** The legal driving age will be raised from 16 to
3 18 in the State of California.

4 **Section 2:** Drivers will be allowed to receive their drivers
5 licenses beginning at the age of 18.

6 **Section 3:** This Bill will be enforced by the Department
7 of Motor Vehicles.

8 **Section 4:** This bill will take place in May 29, 2013.

9 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby
10 declared null and void.

A Bill to Place Economic Sanctions on Libya

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will place economic sanctions on Libya.

3 **SECTION 2.** Economic sanctions will include the withholding of all food and medical
4 aid from Libya as well as refusal to import or export goods to or from
5 Libya.

6 **SECTION 3.** This bill shall be enforced by the State Department, which will ensure
7 compliance by all applicable federal agencies and any American individual
8 or corporate entity.

9 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall be enacted immediately after being passed.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit Plastic Waste

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Manufacturers shall not use plastic bottles to store the water for sale.

3 **SECTION 2.** “Plastic bottles” is defined as all bottled water (e.g. Kirkland, Dasani) that
4 contains at least 20% plastic materials.

5 **SECTION 3.** The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) will oversee this bill and
6 enforce compliance.

7 **SECTION 4.** This law will be effective as of January 1, 2021.

8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill Mandating Public School Uniforms

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All public schools in the State of California shall require that students
3 wear school uniforms.

4 **SECTION 2.** Uniforms will be sold in accordance to the current season to provide
5 easily adaptable conditions in which to learn.

6 **SECTION 3.** Uniforms will be paid for by the parents of the students, provided they
7 are financially able to do so. Parents not able to afford the mandated
8 uniforms shall be reimbursed an amount up to the cost of the uniform.

9 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect January 1, 2015.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict will be declared null and void.

A Bill to Legalize the use of Marijuana

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All federal and state laws making Marijuana illegal will be nullified.

3 **SECTION 2.** The substance will be handled like alcohol. Persons using the substance
4 must be above the age of twenty-one and cannot be under the influence
5 while operating machinery, driving, or in public. Only amounts justified to
6 be for personal consumption will be considered legal.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Drug Enforcement Agency will no longer classify marijuana as a
8 controlled substance. The DEA is also in charge of deciding what amount
9 is considered for personal use and the punishment for otherwise use.

10 **SECTION 4.** The law will take effect on January 1, 2014

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Funding for Anti Drug/Smoking Education

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The U.S. will increase funding for drug and smoking awareness programs
3 in schools.

4 **SECTION 2.** The increase will be two million dollars, and funding is guaranteed.

5 **SECTION 3.** The Office of Safe and Drug-Free Schools (OSDFS) will oversee the
6 enforcement of this bill.

7 **SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Investment in Public Buses

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will increase its investment in public buses by 20%.

3 **SECTION 2.** Public buses are defined as buses which are not reserved privately and
4 are accessible to all.

5 **SECTION 3.** The US Department of Transportation will have primary jurisdiction of
6 this act, and will oversee the distribution of appropriated funds to
7 municipal mass transit systems.

8 **SECTION 4.** Law implementation will take effect 6 months after the bill is passed

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Improve Pell Grants

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Government will make the rules of Pell Grants more
3 flexible and increase funding for Pell Grants.

4 **SECTION 2.** The United States Government will:

5 A. Increase the amount of Pell Grants that will be given up to \$8,000 per
6 recipient.

7 B. Make the eligibility of receiving a Pell Grant more accessible so that
8 people with incomes of between \$60,000 and \$75,000 can receive Pell
9 Grants.

10 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Education will oversee this bill

11 **SECTION 4.** This law will take effect in January 1st 2014

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Abolish the Second Amendment

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **WHEREAS,** The drafters of the Constitution designed the Second Amendment to
3 empower militias for national defense; and

4 **WHEREAS,** Guns are not used for that purpose today; and

5 **WHEREAS,** There are accidental shootings when people have possession of guns; and

6 **WHEREAS,** The right to bear arms has led to mass murders and suicides; and

7 **WHEREAS,** The rate of death by firearms in the United States is very high when
8 compared to other countries; now, therefore, be it

9 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
10 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which
11 shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
12 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
13 seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

14 **ARTICLE --**

15 **SECTION 1:** The Second Amendment is now repealed.

16 **SECTION 2:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate
17 legislation.

A Bill to Limit Soda Consumption

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will limit soda consumption. Retailers will only be
3 permitted to sell soda in cups that are sixteen ounces or less.

4 **SECTION 2.** Soda is defined as a carbonated soft drink sweetened with sugar, high
5 fructose corn syrup, or similar, high-calorie sweetener.

6 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services will enforce this bill.
7 Retailers found in violation of this act will be subject to fines no greater
8 than five thousand dollars.

9 **SECTION 4.** This bill will take effect January 1, 2014.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Federalize Border Security and Increase National Security to Prevent Illegal Immigrants and Drugs from Entering the U.S.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will federalize border agents and increase the amount
3 of border security to halt the flow of drugs and aliens.

4 **SECTION 2.** Jurisdiction will fall to the Drug Enforcement Administration and the U.S.
5 Border Patrol.

6 A) Any drug related problem will fall to the DEA, and any illegal
7 immigrant is the Border Patrol's jurisdiction.

8 B) A seizure of a large amount of cash and/or weapons will be
9 placed under federal control.

10 **SECTION 3.** Anything else that is confiscated would be handed over to the
11 appropriate government agency(s).

12 **SECTION 4.** Funding will come from the federal budget, and 25% of the money seized
13 will be used to ensure enforcement of this act.

14 **SECTION 5.** Implementation will begin 6 months after the bill is passed.

15 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Repeal the Affordable Care Act

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The United States shall repeal the Affordable Care Act.
3. **SECTION 2.** The Affordable Care Act is The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of
4. 2010, in its entirety.
5. **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Health & Human Services shall oversee this act.
6. **SECTION 4.** This law shall take effect July 1, 2013
7. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Establish a No-Fly Zone Over Syria

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall establish a no-fly zone over the country of Syria

3 **SECTION 2.** A no-fly zone shall be defined as an area where no aircraft can fly.

4 **SECTION 3.** The USAFCENT (United States Air Force Central), a military branch

5 under USCENTCOM (United States Central Command), shall be in

6 operational command of implementing the no fly-zone.

7 **SECTION 4.** This implementation shall take place immediately

8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Include the “People’s Rights Amendment”

1 **BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Student Congress here assembled that the Constitution
2 should be amended to include the “People’s Rights Amendment,” which
3 reads:

4

5 Section 1. We the people who ordain and establish this Constitution intend the
6 rights protected by this Constitution to be the rights of natural persons.

7

8 Section 2. People, person, or persons as used in this Constitution does not
9 include corporations, limited liability companies or other corporate entities
10 established by the laws of any state, the United States, or any foreign state, and
11 such corporate entities are subject to such regulation as the people, through
12 their elected state and federal representatives, deem reasonable and are
13 otherwise consistent with the powers of Congress and the States under this
14 Constitution.

15

16 Section 3. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit the people's
17 rights of freedom of speech, freedom of the press, free exercise of religion, and
18 such other rights of the people, which rights are inalienable.

A Bill Granting Amnesty to Illegal Immigrants

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Current illegal immigrants residing in the United States shall be granted
3 complete amnesty. The Department of Homeland Security shall be
4 allocated new funding to increase border security and safety.

5 **SECTION 2.** Amnesty shall be defined as complete citizenship for former illegal
6 immigrants. Border security will be increased through steps defined by
7 the Department of Homeland Security

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Homeland Security shall oversee implementation of
9 this bill:

10 A. 1.63 Billion dollars will be added to its current funding in an effort to
11 fund necessary steps to ensure safety and security

12 B. Guaranteed citizenship will be the current priority, while a border
13 security plan will be expected by January 1st, 2015 for
14 implementation.

15 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall go into effect July 1st, 2013

16 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
