

A Resolution to Urge the U.S. Justice Department to Intervene in State Voter ID Laws

1. **WHEREAS**, More states are passing restrictive voter ID laws; and
2. **WHEREAS**, These laws are concretely politically motivated; and
3. **WHEREAS**, There is no evidence of any or reasonably enough voter fraud to justify these laws; and
4. **WHEREAS**, These laws violate the Voting Rights Act of 1965; and
5. **WHEREAS**, These voter ID laws disenfranchise millions of legal and already registered voters throughout the country; now, therefore, be it
6. **RESOLVED**, by the Student Congress here assembled that Congress will urge the U.S. Justice Department and comprising federal courts of the judiciary to intervene in states that have oppressive and unjustified voter ID laws.
