Tournament fees are as follows:

School Fee: \$10

Fee per debater: \$10

Fee per coach, judge, observers eating: \$10

Uncovered Team Fee: \$30

Parking Permits are Free for the Warmup.

Each school needs to provide N-I judging (with a minimum of 1 judge).

Judging you need: 1 team = 1 judge; 2 teams = 1 judge; 3 teams = 2 judges; 4 teams = 3 judges; 5 teams = 4 judges, etc.
