\$100 per uncovered debate slot (One judge covers 2 LD/PD/PFD slots)

\$20 per change after Wednesday May 9th at 12:00 p.m. PST.

\$50 dropped judge fee after May 10th at 12:00 p.m. PST.*

***To ensure that the tournament starts on time and runs smoothly, we are instituting a \$25 nuisance fee for any/all judges who do not check in at the judge's table 15 minutes before the first round.**

Please notify us before the tournament if your judges plan to switch out. We will need the names of the original judge and the replacement judge and the time of the scheduled switch. Failure to notify the tournament before a switch may result in penalty fees. A common mistake is when a team enters two judges without notifying the tournament about a switch, so we are left to believe that two judges will be at the tournament the entire time. Please avoid this kind of confusion and delays to the tournament by notifying us early.
